



- Equipment Upgrades to protect our students and support their well-being:
 - a. High security entrance vestibule at each campus
 - b. Access control system for building entrances
 - c. Enhanced front entrance cameras and intercoms, along with cameras on the exterior of all buildings to provide security monitoring
 - d. 27 campuses also received updates to fire alarm equipment
 - e. Fire suppression system upgrades
 - f. Door prop alarms
 - g. Door hardware changes to secure classrooms and meet ADA compliance




