- You MUST show proof of your enrollment the FIRST day of clinic in order to participate in clinic and auditions
- All paperwork is due on the first day of clinic- participants will not be allowed to participate if ALL paperwork is not submitted!!!

TRYOUT REMINDERS:

- All current varsity drill team members will be required to try out for the team each year. Failure to participate in the tryout process will result in removal from the team. **EXCEPTION**: Drill team members who have already been selected to serve as an officer for the next school year will be exempt from the line tryouts.
- Only those students auditioning for the drill team will be allowed into the gym area.
- All Hopefuls will have an individual number and a group number assigned to them. Each group will consist of 3-5 dancers.
- Hopefuls should wear appropriate drill team make-up.
- NO jewelry and hair must be in a slicked back low ponytail & center part.
- Attire: black leotard, black leggings, jazz shoes
- Each Hopeful must remain at the audition site until the final group has performed, in the event that callbacks are necessary.

<u>A Year in Review:</u>

• Football Season: (August to November)

Fall is football season and the beginning of our year! The Sweethearts will perform at all football games, away and home. <u>Members will try out for each football routine</u> <u>and field entrance.</u> All members are expected to attend all games with the team. On Game Day, we will stay at LCHS and ride a bus to and from all games.

• GISD Parades: (September and January)

The Sweethearts are required to participate in two parades- the Labor Day parade on Labor Day and the MLK Day parade the Saturday before the MLK Day holiday.

• <u>UIL Fall Assessment:</u> (November)

The Sweethearts will compete a field routine at the Dance/Drill team UIL Fall Assessment.

• Basketball Season: (November- February)

The Sweethearts will perform at select basketball games throughout the season. Sweethearts are required to attend the games chosen. We will not travel to out of town *regular* season basketball games.

• <u>Christmas Noon Exchange Community Service Event:</u> (December)

The Sweethearts LOVE this event! During the season on giving, the Sweethearts will shop at Walmart for less privileged children, then perform and pass out their gifts at during the Christmas Party held at the Curtis Culwell Center. This event is hosted by the GISD Noon Exchange Program.

• <u>Contest Season:</u> (February)

Contest is an exciting time! The girls learn four team routines to compete at Contest and tryout for each one. Contest requires LOTS of extra practices. Contests will take place on two Saturdays during February.

• UIL Spring Assessment: (February)

The Sweethearts will compete a contest routine at the Dance/Drill team UIL Spring Assessment.

• Spring Show Season: (April)

Spring Show is another amazing time for the Sweethearts and is held in the LCHS Auditorium. The girls will participate in a number of routines together and with specialty groups within the team. It will be their opportunity to show all they have learned throughout the year. As well as program ad sales, many fundraisers will be held to cover lights, programs, choreography, and costumes.

CONCUSSION ACKNOWLEDGEMENT FORM

Name of Student:

Definition of Concussion - means a complex pathophysiological process affecting the brain caused by a traumatic physical force or impact to the head or body, which may: (A) include temporary or prolonged altered brain function resulting in physical, cognitive, or emotional symptoms or altered sleep patterns; and (B) involve loss of consciousness.

Prevention – Teach and practice safe play & proper technique.

- Follow the rules of play.
- Make sure the required protective equipment is worn for all practices and games.
- Protective equipment must fit properly and be inspected on a regular basis.

Signs and Symptoms of Concussion – The signs and symptoms of concussion may include but are not limited to: Headache, appears to be dazed or stunned, tinnitus (ringing in the ears), fatigue, slurred speech, nausea or vomiting, dizziness, loss of balance, blurry vision, sensitive to light or noise, feel foggy or groggy, memory loss, or confusion.

Oversight - Each district shall appoint and approve a Concussion Oversight Team (COT). The COT shall include at least one physician and an athletic trainer if one is employed by the school district. Other members may include: Advanced Practice Nurse, neuropsychologist or a physician's assistant. The COT is charged with developing the Return to Play protocol based on peer reviewed scientific evidence.

Treatment of Concussion - The student-athlete/cheerleader shall be removed from practice or participation immediately if suspected to have sustained a concussion. Every student-athlete/cheerleader suspected of sustaining a concussion shall be seen by a physician before they may return to athletic or cheerleading participation. The treatment for concussion is cognitive rest. Students should limit external stimulation such as watching television, playing video games, sending text messages, use of computers, and bright lights. When all signs and symptoms of concussion have cleared and the student has received written clearance from a physician, the student-athlete/cheerleader may begin their district's Return to Play protocol as determined by the Concussion Oversight Team.

Return to Play - According to the Texas Education Code, Section 38.157:

A student removed from an interscholastic athletics practice or competition (including per UIL rule, cheerleading) under Section 38.156 may not be permitted to practice or participate again following the force or impact believed to have caused the concussion until: (1) the student has been evaluated, using established medical protocols based on peer-reviewed scientific evidence, by a treating physician chosen by the student or the student 's parent or guardian or another person with legal authority to make medical decisions for the student;

(2) the student has successfully completed each requirement of the return-to-play protocol established under Section 38.153 necessary for the student to return to play;

(3) the treating physician has provided a written statement indicating that, in the physician 's professional judgment, it is safe for the student to return to play; and

(4) the student and the student 's parent or guardian or another person with legal authority to make medical decisions for the student: (A) have acknowledged that the student has completed the requirements of the return-to-play protocol necessary for the student to return to play;

(B) have provided the treating physician 's written statement under Subdivision (3) to the person responsible for compliance with the return-to-play protocol under Subsection (c) and the person who has supervisory responsibilities under Subsection (c); and (C) have signed a consent form indicating that the person signing:

(i) has been informed concerning and consents to the student participating in returning to play in accordance with the return-to play protocol;

(ii) understands the risks associated with the student returning to play and will comply with any ongoing requirements in the return-to-play protocol;

(iii) consents to the disclosure to appropriate persons, consistent with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (Pub. L. No. 104-191), of the treating physician 's written statement under Subdivision (3) and, if any, the return-to-play recommendations of the treating physician; and

(iv) understands the immunity provisions under Section 38.159.
